The Mission of the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer

Welcome to the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer!

We are glad you are with us today! Please feel free to join with us in our worship this morning in any way you are able or you are welcome to merely sit and listen to our liturgy. We want you to feel comfortable.

Communion: The sharing of bread and wine in the Holy Eucharist has been special to Christians for almost two thousand years and we are eager to share this sacrament with you. Ushers will direct you to come forward and if you follow what the person in front of you does you will be just fine. Generally, people lift their hands with palms facing upwards to have the bread placed in their hands by the priests. We usually receive the wine by either guiding the chalice to our lips as the chalice holds it or, if you prefer, you may receive the wine by dipping the host (bread) in the intinction cup which is held by a standing chalice just to the side of the altar rail.

If you do not wish to receive the bread and wine but would like to receive a blessing from the priest, just kneel at the rail and cross your arms over your chest. Gluten free bread is available on request.

Nursery: Nursery workers provide care for small children from birth to age 3 in the nursery on the east end of the building.

Children are especially welcome in our midst. If you have children with you this morning you might wish to pick up an

activity bag from the table just outside the Nave door. Children are invited to participate actively in all aspects of our worship service.

Restrooms: are located in the hallway behind the Pinder Hall kitchen in the wing parallel to the worship space and off the Foyer to the Parish Hall. A changing station is located in the Women's room by Pinder Hall.

Saying Hello: Please join us for coffee hour in Pinder Hall after the services. We would enjoy an opportunity to meet you and answer any questions you might have.

Parking: is located behind the church facilities. There is a handicapped entrance and parking for those using it on the front of the church.
